ARTIFACTS INFORMATION

Useful items that can be provided to assist with projects are XML schema/database schema export, comprehensive sample dataset for each record type (Log Dataset/Images), Code tables (Code value, Description), Data Dictionary (Define/describe elements, data types, etc.), Data Relationship Diagram(s) (Entity Relationship or Unified Modeling Language diagrams).

Note: All development artifacts provided will be retained for up to 10 years in a secure location for future troubleshooting purposes.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Application will be installed at the agency. This application is designed to provide automatic updates. The agency's point of contacts will be notified via email of upcoming updates. The agency designated computer must:

Agency needs to identify a technical point of contact for application installation on the agency designated computer. The technical point of contact must:

- Be able to access the data source (database or flat files).
- Be able to access the Internet for transmission of files (SFTP, Web Service).
- Be able to write to the file system to create files.

- Be able to install and make configuration changes.
- Be able to test the application.
- Be able to set-up a scheduled task.

NOTE: We suggest minimal specification of 2GB memory and 1GB storage for the agency designated computer.
